Midwest Young Artists announces that three of its bright young students have been named as YoungArts finalists, and will compete for cash prizes and the chance to be named Presidential Scholars in the Arts.

According to a release from YoungArts, this year's finalists represent the top 3% of applicants and were selected through a blind adjudication process from a pool of 5,164 applications. These students, recognized for their excellent work in nine disciplines across the visual, literary and performing arts, will come to Miami for the national YoungArts Week, January 10-15, 2011. The art forms range from world dance to woodwinds; from non-fiction writing to jazz trumpet, and the young artists hail from 27 states throughout the U.S. During YoungArts Week, all finalists will participate in master classes with internationally renowned artists, workshops, interdisciplinary activities, performances and exhibitions. Additionally, they will receive monetary awards starting at \$1,000, with the upper echelon receiving \$10,000.

These finalists will be adjudicated to determine further award levels, including participation in the special, New York City-based In The Studio/Out of the Studio, another week of workshops for YoungArts Gold and Silver finalists. NFAA is also the sole nominating agency for the Presidential Scholars in the Arts, the highest honor that can be awarded to any artistically talented graduating high school senior, and 20 YoungArts finalists will be named Presidential Scholars in the Arts.

- Jazz – Ben Solomon, sax from New Trier High School
- Music – Amy Pikler, recorder from New Trier HS (violin and viola)
- Music – Frank Wu, piano from Stevenson HS
